2019 Accomplishments:

1. Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Service Day along Pony Express Trail
2. CEDAPP sponsored many fundraising projects and events to help with the renovation of our Fire House #17. At the first CEDAPP meeting of 2020, January 13, we gave a check to the new Chief, Tim Cordero, in the amount of \$13,000. There are still fundraising projects in the community and two more major events planned for the spring and the summer.
3. In addition to the regular CEDAPP functions, it was decided to form a FUN business kind of meeting which would only happen 4 times during the year. These meetings took the place of the usual CEDAPP meeting and were entirely based on coming together as a business community and having FUN while discussing pertinent, relevant topics for rural small businesses. They were held at the following locations: ZGroup Real Estate, Pizza Factory, Burger Barn and Pony Express Shipping.

In May, under the leadership of Lauralee Green, and the ZGroup staff, the Hands Across Pollock Community Clean-up Day was another hit getting rid of thousands of tons of debris in 2 different locations. Keeping our community pristine is more than a cleanliness thing; it also warns the bad guys to stay away. We are a clean and well-kept community.
5. Hosting one of the biggest National Nights Out in August, was a treat for all, including the youngsters in the bounce house and playing all the games provided by the Cub Scouts. Live music, free hotdogs, and raffles were the hit of the afternoon. In tandem with the Clean-up Day, National Night Out sends a very strong message to the ne’er do wells that may lurk in our crevasses.
6. In between fundraising efforts for the fire station, this year’s Trunk or Treat was a resounding success as our new project Manager, Heather Bailey (and family), added food and raffles to the event. Well over 300 people attended the fun night held at the Pinewood Elementary School.
7. In November, CEDAPP hosted the 13th annual The Stars Come Out community awards banquet. The location changed to Apple Mountain Golf Resort due to size restrictions at 50 Grand. Three young people were honored for their civic leadership and the CEDAPP ED Awards went to Deputy Josh Sprague, our resident deputy in Pollock Pines. Also receiving an ED Award for the Fire Station #17, was Captain Trent Williams. Chief Lloyd Ogan gave the opening speech which focused on Relevancy.
8. On Saturday, December 7, the skies were again lit up in joyful celebration of the annual Christmas Tree Lighting and Trees for Teens. A record-breaking number of Trees for Teens were purchased in order to purchase special gifts for the needy and well deserving Teens in Pollock Pines. Thanks for Heather Bailey who also managed this huge project.

Dear Pollock Pines/CEDAPP supporters:

CEDAPP has been in the business of providing projects and events in Pollock Pines designed to maintain community ambiance and/or fix things that need to be repaired. We have been doing this for 13 years. Additionally, the projects and events that we do are free of charge to our residents, businesses, and organizations. During that time only once did we raise the dues and that was about 10 years ago.

However, in the past couple of years some changes have occurred that have resulted in the necessity to raise our membership costs. Even with grant writing and other forms of random donations, our two main expenses (insurance and storage) have skyrocketed. In discussing this change at the meeting in January, it was unanimously approved to raise the membership dues by \$10 annually. This comes to about an \$.83 per month addition.

We are always looking to save money so if anyone has a good idea about how to cut down on the storage cost of \$175/month for 13 years' worth of items, we would be so appreciative.

This year (2020) will see other changes, too, none of which will cost a community person any money, but since people change, especially in leadership positions, new ideas come to the forefront. This is what makes America great and this is what makes Pollock Pines great – new ideas, fresh blood leading the way, and different kinds of responses....which leads to even more innovations.

In February of this year, 2020, CEDAPP will once again host a Feel the Pulse/Summit Meeting for all of the service organizations, interested businesses, and committed residents. The goal will be to discuss current community concerns, share goals, and reaffirm community collaboration. Working together as teams helps to drive the infrastructure of our unincorporated community into a fairly smooth and seamless operation, together with the help of the county government. (Yes, sometimes we do need the government!)

The attached is your 2020 Membership Invoice. In order to save money, we will not be mailing them this year. So, please do pass this message along to everyone you know that loves Pollock Pines and wants to help keep her beautiful, active, and a magnificent place to live, work, and play. We can't do this without you.
